Dear Church Family,

Over the past months, Pastor Riley has requested each of us to give our best offering. Like any household, our church faces the same issues as yours but on a larger scale. There's a continuous need for funds for repair, replacement, and updating. However, our first priority is to gather and worship God in the manner we have chosen, help our community, and spread the Gospel as Jesus has taught us. We must balance these priorities with keeping the doors of the church open.

The following information is last year's operating revenues, income/expense results for 2024:

Income \$412,440 Expenses \$<u>436,669</u> Total -\$24,229

As money is received, it is divided into two accounts. One is the general or operational account (think bills, staff salaries, loan payments), and the other is the designated account, which members have requested their tithes to support. Expenditures from the *designated* account can only go toward the specific item as requested by the giver. The *operation* account funds are limited to contributions that are not specified. We are financially healthy with designated giving; however, as you can see, the operation account is needy. There are numerous reasons for this, but the deficit is mainly a result of decreased tithes.

The Financial Committee has taken steps to improve the situation in 2025. The Committee reconstructed the budget to better align with projected income, coordinated with all church departments to improve expenditures, supported an office manager position, established an emergency fund to help meet unexpected expenses and set new policies to ensure incomes are aligned with costs.
